- Maintain a current web page on the Internet to provide current information to the members and facilitate the exchange of information between members, with appropriate links for the convenience of members, prospective members, or legitimate researchers, having access to the internet; and
- Conduct periodic reunions.

The Trez Sez



During the last two months, we were able to recover some additional unrealized losses that began at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. As of August 31, we have total assets of \$118,592.29 with another \$23,338.10 in funds reserved for the Fall 2021 Reunion (Advances of Registration Fees and Excursions). Almost one third of our assets are in a low interest bearing money market fund or no-interest bearing checking account. We will be revisiting our investment strategies, especially our cash assets, when markets settle down more. USAA recently has turned over its investment services to Schwab, who continues to offer the same level of service, which includes the no cost RAFINO investment account.

We still have 74 members who are not current with their dues after we

dropped 19, who were over three years past due, and dropped an additional 16, who had joined our organization but never had paid their initial dues. That leaves us with 455 paid-up members and an additional 231 surviving spouses.

Finally, our count of attendees has not changed, as we currently have 41 members and 32 guests for a total of 73 attending who are still registered and paid in full for the Fall 2021 Reunion.

Time: 5 minutes

Serves: 8

Serving size: 1/2 cup

Ingredients:

- 1 can white corn, drained
- 1 can black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 can diced tomatoes (14.5 ounces)
- 1 bunch green onions, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil, cold pressed
- 1/4 cup white wine vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 3/4 teaspoon Himalayan crystal salt
- 1/2 teaspoon whole peppercorns, ground
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin

Instructions:

- 1. Toss all ingredients together gently.
- 2. Serve at room temperature with tortilla chips.

RAFINO is a fraternal/social veterans' organization put together and run entirely for the enjoyment of soldiers who spent at least a large part of their Army life as Financial Management soldiers. Every Finance soldier eligible for retirement is eligible for membership in RAFINO. The organization offers a fun way to stay in contact with your friends and renew friendships with those whom you may have lost contact with over the years.

The original By-Laws were unanimously approved by the officers of RAFINO on the 31st of August 1987. The vote was based on mail replies of charter members the great majority of whom approved such formation of this society and the necessary steps to make it a non-profit veterans' organization.

The purposes above may be summarized in one word: fellowship. The two societies come together every two years for a festive Reunion. Cities where the Reunions have been held in the past include Washington, D.C., Indianapolis, Las Vegas, Ft. Jackson, Orlando, Williamsburg, Branson, Tacoma, San Antonio, Baton Rouge, and in 2018, Albuquerque. These venues offer a great opportunity to not only visit great spots in the U.S. but, as mentioned above, visit with old friends and meet some new ones.

On October 15, 2016, the previous sister organization, RAFINCO, merged its membership and assets into RAFINO, making the RAFINO the single place for all ranks of retired Army finance soldiers.
