# The Trez Sez

Everything still looks good in our investment portfolio, as our assets total \$134,258.62 through September 5, 2021, including unrealized gains of \$6,233. This does not include any of the funds related to our canceled Charleston Reunion, nor the assets transferred to the Indianapolis Reunion in 2022. Due to the generosity of Russ Dowden and John Fruin, we are able to cover the total costs incurred for the reunion: PayPal and credit card fees as well as the cancellation fee at our Charleston Hotel and a small fee for the canceled activities. Thank you, Russ and John!

Our current membership stands at 515 dues-paying members and 235 surviving spouses. The 515 number includes 311 life members as well as 75 members who are behind in the payment of their dues. This is down from 84 members who were

in that status the last quarter. For the first time since we established the life membership, the total number of life members has declined, as more members have passed away than joined the ranks.

As of September 5, we have sent refunds to 25 members and their 25 guests for Charleston prepayments, but we are currently still carrying 30 paid members and their 18 guests, some who have already requested that we carry forward their funds and apply them to the 2022 Indianapolis Reunion. If you wish to do the same, please let me kno, so we can accomplish the transfer. You should see a refund check in 7-10 days. In either case, please let me know your preference.

#### THE SECRET TO CROCKPOT (SLOW COOKER) RIBS

Remove the membrane from the back of the ribs. Just slide your fingers around the side to loosen it up and rip it right off.

Give the ribs a dry rub. This step is optional. Some people like a good dry rub first for additional flavor.

Put your ribs in the crockpot. Lather them with barbecue sauce. You can use a homemade sauce like Raspberry-Chipotle Barbecue Sauce for ribs or a store-bought bottle. Just remember to save a little bit for later.

Cook on low for 8 to 10 hours. The more racks in the pot, the longer you'll need to cook.

Wendell W. Fenn BG November 4, 2019

BG Wendell W. Fenn was born on August 8, 1922, in Kokomo, Indiana to Floyd and Elsie Fenn. Wendell enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1940 at age 18. Two years later he rose to the rank of Master Sergeant and in early 1944 he graduated from Officer Candidate School. As a Second Lieutenant, he served as a member of the 101st Airborne glider troops and on June 5, 1944, one day before D-Day, he glided into Normandy as an early wave of the Allied invasion of Western Europe. From there he fought his way through the European theatre, was at the Battle of the Bulge and received two Purple Hearts along the way for wounds he received in combat. After WWII, Wendell attended college under the GI Bill and received degrees in both accounting and law. Wendell was a career military man and served in a variety of roles, including several posts at the Pentagon. BG Fenn retired in 1982 after 42 years of service. Wendell is preceded in death by his wife of 70 years, Betty Jane Wilcox Fenn, and his daughter, Jane Ann Jackman. He is survived by his son Mickey (Paula) Fenn.

RAFINO is a fraternal/social veterans' organization put together and run entirely for the enjoyment of soldiers who spent at least a large part of their Army life as Financial Management soldiers. Every Finance soldier eligible for retirement is eligible for membership in RAFINO. The organization offers a fun way to stay in contact with your friends and renew friendships with those whom you may have lost contact with over the years.

The original By-Laws were unanimously approved by the officers of RAFINO on the 31 of August 1987. The vote was based on mail replies of charter members the great majority of whom approved such formation of this society and the necessary steps to make it a non-profit veterans' organization.

The purposes above may be summarized in one word: fellowship. The two societies come together every two years for a festive Reunion. Cities where the Reunions have been held in the past include Washington, D.C., Indianapolis, Las Vegas, Ft. Jackson, Orlando, Williamsburg, Branson, Tacoma, San Antonio, Baton Rouge, and in 2018, Albuquerque. These venues offer a great opportunity to not only visit great spots in the U.S. but, as mentioned above, visit with old friends and meet some new ones.

On October 15, 2016, the previous sister organization, RAFINCO, merged its membership and assets into RAFINO, making the RAFINO the single place for all ranks of retired Army finance soldiers.
